- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue

- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Unusual congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Contact with a confirmed case of Covid-19
