We have a busy but short week ahead; so I am starting with Parent/Teacher/Student conference information. Please read through, there is lots of information for the week!

Parent/Teacher/Student conferences:

CCA is continuing to follow state guidelines on masking. We ask our parents to do so as well. Conferences for all grades will be held from 4-7 Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings. We ask that you keep your conference to fewer than 20 minutes. If the conference needs more time, your teacher will invite you to return on a different day. Please be respectful of the time. -For the K-5th grade conferences, you are welcome to use either the exterior classroom door or the interior classroom door. The main doors will be open. The weather looks quite chilly this week so please utilize whichever door you please.

- -Middle school conferences will be held in the gym and all middle school core teachers will be available to conference.
- Cardinal After School Care will be open until 7pm each evening and is free for CCA students. We ask that only CCA students attend the After School Care.

Covid Guidance for 2021-2022

Ultimately, we all want students to be able to attend school in-person. To do so, we must all work together to ensure a healthy school year. CCAI will follow the guidance set out by the CDPHE, CDE, & RE3j.

- We will do our best to minimize any disruptions to the learning environment; therefore, in
 the case of a positive Covid diagnosis, the afflicted student/staff will be asked to stay
 home until they can safely return. All students/staff considered close contacts will be
 notified, asked to watch for symptoms, and may remain in school unless they become
 symptomatic. We should see fewer remote learning times this year as long as we can
 stay home when not feeling well. Please continue to be conscientious when sending
 your child to school.
- All schools received new guidance 9/10/21 for <u>quarantining</u> due to the increase in positive cases of Covid in elementary aged students in the state of Colorado.
- We should not have to move to a large-scale remote learning situation unless our numbers of students or staff infected is five or more cases of COVID-19, of which at least one case has had a positive molecular amplification test or antigen test, among students/teachers/staff from separate households with onset within 14 days in a single classroom/activity or other close contact in the school setting (including transportation tofrom- school and affiliated events). *CDPHE June 2021
- As we did last year, we will be in contact with families regarding possible exposure and/or any closures due to Covid-19.
- We will continue to cohort students and limit the amount of time students are out of their cohort. Students leaving their cohort during an unscheduled time will be asked to wear a mask, just like last year. Anticipate very little mask wearing but students should be prepared. Please send a clean mask with your student(s) each day.
- Adults in the building will stay with a specific cohort unless it is not possible, for example Interventionists.
- Students will have their own supplies; classroom supplies will be minimized and in cases, such as Art, PE, Music, or STEM, those items will be cleaned between classes.
- Students will not have access to microwaves, drinking fountains (the bottle fillers will be available) or other high touch-point surfaces, just like last year to minimize the opportunity for viruses to pass from hand to eyes or mouth.
- We will clean continuously throughout the day and eat/play outside as much as possible for the health of our students.

I know these guidelines are not what we all would love to have but I truly appreciate everyone keeping a positive outlook as we follow these few guidelines that will allow us to remain in-person. Please watch for more information from RE3j in the near future and I will continue to update you with any changes to this plan.
